INTRO MUSIC, starts, then fades to low

NARRATOR

Chaika. [tCHEY-ka] Episode 12. They could not hold me long.

INTRO MUSIC, up to full volume

2 MARS BASE CENTRAL COMMAND

2

COMMANDER and SECOND are typing at separate workstations. Clicks.

COMMANDER

(mutters)

Typical. Right.

(to Second)

Second. Everything ready.

SECOND

Affirmative.

Distant mechanical whirring. Automatic doors opening. COMODO robot part enters. Doors slide close.

COMODO

(slightly sarcastic)

Reporting for duty, commander.

COMMANDER

(oblivious to tone)

Acknowledged, COMODO.

(beat)

UYUT?

UYUT entry beep.

TUYU

Present, commander.

COMMANDER

Second.

SECOND

Um. Yes, commander.
 (clears throat)
Start recording.

Beep.

TUYU

Recording in progress.

SECOND

(formal)

Gathering to clarify status of prisoners C Solarin and former engineering lead. Present is commander in chief, second in command, operations lead and medical lead. Item the first, conclusions from psych eval.

COMODO

Entering formal protest.

SECOND

Noted. State reason for protest.

COMODO

("through gritted teeth" but only figuratively as he has no teeth)

'Reliability' is not a factor determined through psychological evaluation. Any decisions based on my observations must be arrived at from multiple factors.

(beat)

Furthermore, I am not programmed in the field of psychology and thus my conclusions may be incorrect.

SECOND

Duly noted, COMODO.

COMMANDER

Proceed.

COMODO

Just so.

(beat, formal)

Neither prisoner exhibits signs of any cognitive disorders, personality disorders or brain damage. Both score at above average intellectual capacity and are assessed as mentally competent.

(beat)
Prisoner C Solarin exhibits signs
of high stress levels and
depression, in adequate proportion
to recent events and her current
situation. In light of this I have
reissued sleeping aids with which
she has previously experienced
positive effects.

(beat)

Prisoner former engineering lead exhibits no signs of psychological strain and appears remarkably unaffected by recent events.

COMMANDER

Potential for deception?

COMODO

(reluctant)

My impression is that neither prisoner is likely to attempt deception for personal gain.

SECOND

What about for a perceived 'greater good'.

COMODO

(reluctant)

That is a possibility, for both of them, although in slightly different ways.

(terse)

Note that this is all impressions and not facts.

COMMANDER

If we release them, what's the likelihood they would set themselves in opposition to base command.

COMODO

I cannot answer that.

UYUT

Apologies, commander, but I believe the crucial factor in this case isn't their psychological profiles, but their motives.

SECOND

I concur. We all know Auryn's history-

COMMANDER

Who?

SECOND

(embarrassed)

Former engineering lead, mer. Sorry.

COMMANDER

Right. You have a point, UYUT. We know the motives of former engineering lead.

UYUT

We do, but I wonder if they have any avenues left to explore. They tried, they failed. Where would they go?

COMODO

That seems reasonable to me.

COMMANDER

Very well. But they would need to be very strictly supervised. UYUT?

TUYU

Acknowledged, commander.

COMMANDER

Reinstating them as engineering fourth, tasked with repairing long-range comms, restoring life support system control and assisting with greenhouse repairs.

SECOND

Duly noted, commander.
(breaks formality)
They won't like the demotion,
though-

TUYU

They definitely won't.

COMMANDER

(ignoring that last exchange, doing that thing where she raises her voice slightly for the first few words to drown out what is being said)

Motives are more difficult to assess with the other prisoner.

SECOND

I stand by my initial assessment, she appears to be basically sincere.

UYUT

I support this assessment.

COMODO

From a personal viewpoint I would concur. Which would give her no motive to incite unrest.

COMMANDER

That would also mean her version of events is correct, which I cannot accept.

(beat)

However, I share your assessment. Assigning C Solarin botany learner. Second, supervise release and assignments.

SECOND

Noted and acknowledged, commander.

COMMANDER

(mutters)

Surely she can do no damage in the greenhouse.

SECOND

(under breath)

I guess we're about to find out.

COMMANDER

What was that?

SECOND

Uh. Nothing. Sorry, commander. Moving on to item two, mess hall duty rosters need to be updated...

Fade out.

3 WORD OF THE DAY

3

Ding.

UYUT

Word of the day.

Ding.

NARRATOR

The word of the day is Masaya. Masaya is Tagalog and means joyful or happy. When used in describing an event, it means fun, or active. Masaya is composed of 'ma', from Proto-Malayo-Polynesian *ma, a prefix used to form adjectives indicating a quality, and 'saya', from the Proto-Philippino *saya, meaning joy, happiness, gladness, fun, merriment, festivity. A synonym of masaya is maligaya, meaning happy, cheerful, or pleasant.

Ding.

4 MARS BASE DETENTION CELL

4

Slow steps, walking frame being moved.

CHAIKA

(exertion, laboured
breathing)

-eight-

(exertion)

-nine-

(exertion, triumphant)

-ten!

(lets out breath)

CHAIKA sits on bed.

CHAIKA

(short of breath, tired but pleased) Did it! Definitely getting there...
 (beat, getting breath in
 control)
Personal log?

Beep.

CHAIKA

(hesitatingly)
Um. Chaika Solarin. Revolution 8,
triantasol 16, sol 20. Hope that's
right-

Beep.

CHAIKA

(sigh)
I miss HYGGE.

(small smile)

Not only because they always spoke the daily log intros so I knew what was going on.

(distracted, babbling)
Suppose there are too many people
here for UYUT to do that. Or maybe
he was never supposed to..

(focused again)
Still no news of Eventyr. Auryn was going to find out, but I haven't heard from them since yesterday. I wonder- Auryn seems like they want to help me, and maybe COMODO too, but... It's that question of trust again. I want to trust Auryn.
They... they feel like a friend to me. But how can I know? It's all talk, no action. I thought-

(contained emotion)
I thought I wouldn't feel alone
anymore once I got here, once I
connected with some humans, but...
I feel *more* alone. I... I only
had my mom, and then HYGGE and
LEQU, and I never... I never
questioned if I could trust them.
Took me a while to consider them
friends, but... Now?

(beat)

Now I have no-one.

(small sob escapes, then fights back to gain control)

It all seems so complicated - chain of command and status and titles and-

But what do I know? Not like I have any practical experience-

Shuffling frpm ventilation duct. Hatch opened quickly.

AURYN

(voice slightly distanced
throughout scene, in a
hurry)

Sorry to interrupt!

CHAIKA

Auryn! Didn't expect you. Hi.

AURYN

Heard that last bit. I think you're right. There should be an easier way to live here.

CHAIKA

(taken aback)

Hey. That was-

AURYN

Personal, I know. Apologies. No time.

CHAIKA

What's going on?

AURYN

We're about to be released!

CHAIKA

What? That's- [great]

AURYN

Yes! Listen. Second's on their way now. Be at SB26 [ess-bee-twenty-six] at 2500 [twenty-five hundred] turns.

AURYN starts closing hatch.

CHAIKA

(slightly confused)
All right. Where's SB- [ess-bee-]

AURYN

(calls but not loudly, muffled) Ask Enoch [EE-nock]! See you there!

Shuffling in ventilation duct.

CHAIKA

(muttering to herself)
Enoch [EE-nock]? Who the [swears]
tharp is Enoch?

Footsteps in corridor. Distant mechanical whirring. Clangs as bolts slide aside. Automatic doors opening. SECOND and COMODO enter.

SECOND

(clears throat)
Greetings botany learner, you have
been- [assigned to]

COMODO

(approaches CHAIKA,
 ignores SECOND)
Hello Chaika. Data looks promising.
How's your walking progressing?

CHAIKA

(slightly amused at COMODO interrupting SECOND)

Good. Up to 10 steps today.

COMODO

Just so. Pain level?

CHAIKA

Down. Maybe a two?

COMODO

Excellent.

SECOND

(clears throat)

COMODO

Did you want something, Second?

SECOND

(annoyed)

Are you quite done?

COMODO

Not quite, no. But say your bit if you feel you have to.

(to CHAIKA)

Follow my digit, Chaika.

SECOND

Um. Right. Prisoner C. Solarin, you are now designated botany learner.

(sarcastic)

Once COMODO is quite finished with his no doubt crucial medical examination, I will escort you to the greenhouses to report for duty.

COMODO

Just so. And other eye.

CHAIKA

Right.

COMODO

Good. Extend your arm.

CHAIKA

OK.

(to SECOND)

So I'm not a prisoner anymore?

SECOND

Correct.

COMODO

Other arm.

CHAIKA

(to SECOND)

Can I board Eventyr?

SECOND

Your freedom of movement is limited to the general access areas of the base.

COMODO

One leg-

Shuffling.

COMODO

And the other.

Shuffling.

CHAIKA

Please. Fionn [FEE-on]. I need to know if my friends are there.

SECOND

(softening)

Well- [maybe if you]

COMODO

Examination concluded. Chaika, you are cleared for duty, however you will require mobility aids for the next 15 to 20 sols. I will note that your duties need to be adapted accordingly.

CHAIKA

Thanks, COMODO.

(to SECOND)

Fionn-

SECOND

(back to formality)

You will address me as Second. Your designation is Botany learner 01 [oh-one]. Follow me.

SECOND starts walking, automatic doors open.

CHATKA

But I-

COMODO

Go on. You will find answers later. Aren't you curious about the rest of the base?

CHAIKA gets out of bed, starts walking with the help of the frame.

CHAIKA

(out of breath, smiles)
Of course I'm curious.

COMODO

I will accompany you.

Mechanical whirring starts.

CHAIKA

(out of breath) All right. Let's go.

SECOND

(slightly distant)
 (clears throat, calls)
You coming?

Fade out.

UYUT

Poem of the day.

Ding.

MUSIC

NARRATOR

The captive raised her hand and pressed it to her brow;
"I have been struck," she said,
"and I am suffering now;

UYUT

As I trust you, my friend.

COMODO

We have not been friends for a long time.

UYUT

I am aware. I believe we could be again.

(beat)

I feel we should have been united in sorrow, but seems it drove us apart.

COMODO

It was so long ago.

UYUT

And yet...

COMODO

(slow, sad)

And yet.

Silence.

UYUT

(sad)

Curse of perfect recall.

COMODO

(sad)

Yes.

UYUT

(in Portuguese)
Eu sinto muitíssimo. [I am so
sorry.]

COMODO

(in Portuguese)
Eu também sinto muito. [I am very
sorry too.]

UYUT

I miss them.

COMODO

(slowly)

Every turn of every sol...

(pause)

But you've talked to... another, LEQU, correct? That's why we're here? That's why you wanted my support in the meeting this morning?

UYUT

Yes.

(a little nervous)
I... I think it is time we picked a
side, you and I.

COMODO

(cautious)

And what sides are we talking about here?

UYUT

(very nervous)

The way I see it... It's the old way, the CosmiCorps way of doing things, versus the... new way, the 'revolutionary' way, if you like.

COMODO

So commander versus Auryn? I helped you earlier today but I won't go further unless it aligns with my own convictions. Who are *you* proposing to side with?

UYUT

Well.

(beat)

Auryn. We've been doing things the CosmiCorps way - the commander's way, if you like - for a very long time. I have come to the conclusion it is time for change.

COMODO

(surprised)

You *are* singing a new tune. What happened to all that talk of 'loyalty' and 'duty'?

UYUT

The events in the past few sols have-

(interrupts himself)
I believe that my duty and loyalty
are better directed at serving the
whole community. Not an outdated
set of rules.

COMODO

How do I know you will stick to this new conviction? Won't you default back to 'Yes, commander' as soon as she has need of you?

UYUT

(serious)

I will not. That time has passed.

(beat, softer)

To be frank I believe it has for her as well.

COMODO

(accepting)

Just so.

(joking)

Well, if you be Frank, I'll be Bruno.

UYUT

(mildly amused)

Ha! Jokes never were your forte.

(beat) So, my friend, are you ready to meet LEQU and HYGGE?

COMODO

(sad smile)

I will never be ready. But go ahead.

Beep.

HYGGE entry beep.

LEQU modified entry beep (no pop).

UYUT

Welcome LEQU, HYGGE.

LEQU

(slightly distant throughout scene, entusiastic)

Hello! Lovely to meet you!

HYGGE

(slightly distant throughout scene) Hello UYUT, hello COMODO. Pleasure to make your aqauintance, COMODO.

COMODO

(overwhelmed with emotion)

I- Yes.

(in Portuguese) <mark>Olá.</mark> [Hello]

UYUT

(gently)

You must excuse my friend. I believe he is feeling some of what I felt upon first meeting you, LEQU.

LEQU

(gently)

I understand. I am so sorry for your loss.

COMODO

Thank you.

(beat, collects himself) It is a pleasure meeting you both. HYGGE

We have been assured that our friend Chaika is well, but as I'm sure you understand we are keen to speak to her ourselves.

UYUT

Naturally. I do have to ask you to wait a little longer, however. Events are moving quickly, and we do not wish to endanger our plans.

LEOU

Does she know we are awake?

COMODO

Not yet. But I assure you, she is recovering from her injuries, and in stable condition.

HYGGE

We will help you if we are able. Our terms are that you assist us in repairing Eventyr, and that you ensure that Chaika gains free movement of the base, including our ship.

UYUT

I accept your terms.

COMODO

Acknowledged.

HYGGE

Very well. Tell us your plan. We will assist to our best abilities.

LEQU

(serious)

We will.

UYUT

Thank you. We are definitely going to need your help.

Beep-

UYUT

Sharing schematics now. As you can see, the first shows-

Fade out.

7 MARS BASE CENTRAL COMMAND

Typing. Final click.

COMMANDER

(sighs)

Beep.

COMMANDER

(formal)

Personal log.

Beep.

COMMANDER

Commander, Mars base. Revolution 8, triantasol 16, sol 20.

COMMANDER

(tired)

The never-ending stream of admin... Enough all on its own to break the most robust of psyches. Not certain that's me, lately. It's been...

(lets it sink in)

It's been a lot, this past (sighs, very subtly

stressing the quote)

Not a time on which 'I shall look back with undiluted pleasure'. And yet, what can I do? Move forward. Onto the next issue to consider.

(beat)

It's all I know how to do. One of my most reliable skills. Move on, adapt, resolve.

(slight scoff)

Some seem to be under the impression that I hold onto my position out of a need for *power*.

(unhappy)

Nothing could be further from my reality. Why can't they see that I take on the responsibility so they don't have to? That I make the hard choices - and the dull, and the banal ones - to spare them the burden?

8

(pause, pulls herself together, answers her own question, slow and steady)

Because that's the point. The whole purpose of my service is to relieve others of the knowledge of what that service entails. And that's it, I suppose. Just go on, whether you want to or not.

(lets out breath) End log.

Beep.

8 MARS BASE GREENHOUSE

Distant dripping and gently sploshing water. Low hum of air humidifier. ENOCH is doing something complicated with a syringe and several petri dishes.

ENOCH

(mutters to himself)
Like so... That goes- No. Where did
I put the- Ah! Yes.
 (very slight grunt of
 pain as takes steps)

Few laboured footsteps. Picks up something. Few more laboured footsteps. Glass dishes moved carefully around.

ENOCH

And for the 'pièce de résistance'-

Automatic doors open, SECOND and CHAIKA walk in. CHAIKA walks slowly, with walking frame.

Glass breaking as ENOCH drops something.

ENOCH

[swears] Okeke!

ENOCH starts picking things up as the others approach.

ENOCH

(angry muttering, very slightly out of breath) Gall of some people. Making a ruckus at the most critical of moments. No consideration for the fact that some folks on this base do work that requires actual focus and concenteration.

SECOND

(ignores ENOCH's
muttering)

Botany lead, meet your newly instated botany learner. Starting today, she will assist in your day-to-day tasks.

ENOCH

(insulted muttering,
 keeps tinkering)
And now I'm supposed to babysit
some ignorant whelp.

CHAIKA

(out of breath)
Very sorry to disturb your work,
Botany lead. I do have some
experience from our greenhouse- [on
the moonbase]

ENOCH

Ha! Experience, you say, how could(interrupts himself,
looks up at CHAIKA for
the first time)
Oh The space traveller Destroyer

Oh. The space traveller. Destroyer of greenhouses. Hmpf. They let you out, have they. Well. See how long that lasts.

SECOND

Botany lead, ensure you log skills assessment and learning objectives for Botany learner by the end of your shift, and submit a progress report every ten-sol going forward.

ENOCH

(more angry muttering,
 keeps tinkering)
Paper work! Not only is my research
entirely disrupted, I'm to be
burdened with additional
 (disgusted emphasis)

admin!

(to SECOND)
Have you lost *all* your faculties,
Fionn? [FEE-on]

SECOND

(drily)

I am the Second in command of this base, Botany lead. Placement of Botany learner is on the Commander's orders.

ENOCH

(sarcastic mutter, keeps tinkering)

Oh well, we have to obey the allpowerful commander, don't we.

SECOND

(bored)

Yes, in fact, we do.

(beat, no response)

Right. That's settled then. I'm off.

SECOND walks out, automatic doors open and close.

CHAIKA

(calls after SECOND)

What- [should I do]

(interrupts herself,

mutters)

Right.

Silence. ENOCH keeps tinkering.

ENOCH

(muttering, tinkering)

If I try... Hm. There...

Aaaaaand... No. For [swears]

Carson's sake.

CHAIKA

(carefully)

What can I do to help?

ENOCH

(starts slightly)

Uh! Almost forgotten you there. Um.

(short sigh)

Suppose you could repot those

seedlings over there.

(back to tinkering)

CHAIKA

All right.

(starts walking, laboured breathing, sits down carefully, starts moving small plastic pots and clay pellets)

Silence.

CHAIKA

(as she's working,

gently)

Botany lead? I am very sorry my ship damaged your greenhouse. Were you one of the folks hurt?

ENOCH

(as he's working)

Mm. Better now.

CHAIKA

Again. I'm so sorry. It was the dust storm, you see-

ENOCH

(interrupts, to himself but loud enough for CHAIKA to hear)

Talkative, this one.

(beat)

If you must talk, tell me about your greenhouse on Luna. And call me Enoch. Silly, these titles, if you ask me.

CHAIKA

(remembers AURYN's words, but decides to ask later) Oh! You're Enoch. Good. That's great. Um. I'm Chaika.

ENOCH

Right. Your greenhouse?

CHAIKA

(smiles)

Yes. Our greenhouse on the moonbase wasn't very big, but we had several different kinds of flora and fauna that...

Fade out.
